2. ONCE TO MAKE PERFECT

For discussion in small groups and personal reflection:

1. What do we mean when we say that Jesus' sacrifice is timeless, that it is once FOR ALL? See Romans 5:6 and 8 and Hebrews 7:27.
2. When Hebrews tells us that we have been "made perfect" what does that mean? Look up "perfect" in a dictionary or "google it." What does it mean as a verb? Does it mean that we are now morally perfect?
3. If sacrifices done in the Temple or Tabernacle couldn't "take away" sins, what does that tell us about our ability to save ourselves or work to earn or deserve our salvation?
4. What do those in our world tell us should we feel guilty about something that we have done? How is that different than what God tells us about our guilt if we're saved by grace?
5. How does the denial of guilt or the suppression of guilt lead to arrogant legalism? How does the legalist deal with guilt?
6. What do you do when you are feeling guilty or when you know you have sinned?
7. See Hebrews 10:14. How is it that you have been "made perfect" yet are still being "sanctified" or "made holy"?
8. What must we do when we sin against God? What must we do when we sin against another person? Look at Matthew 5:23-24 and Matthew 18:15.
